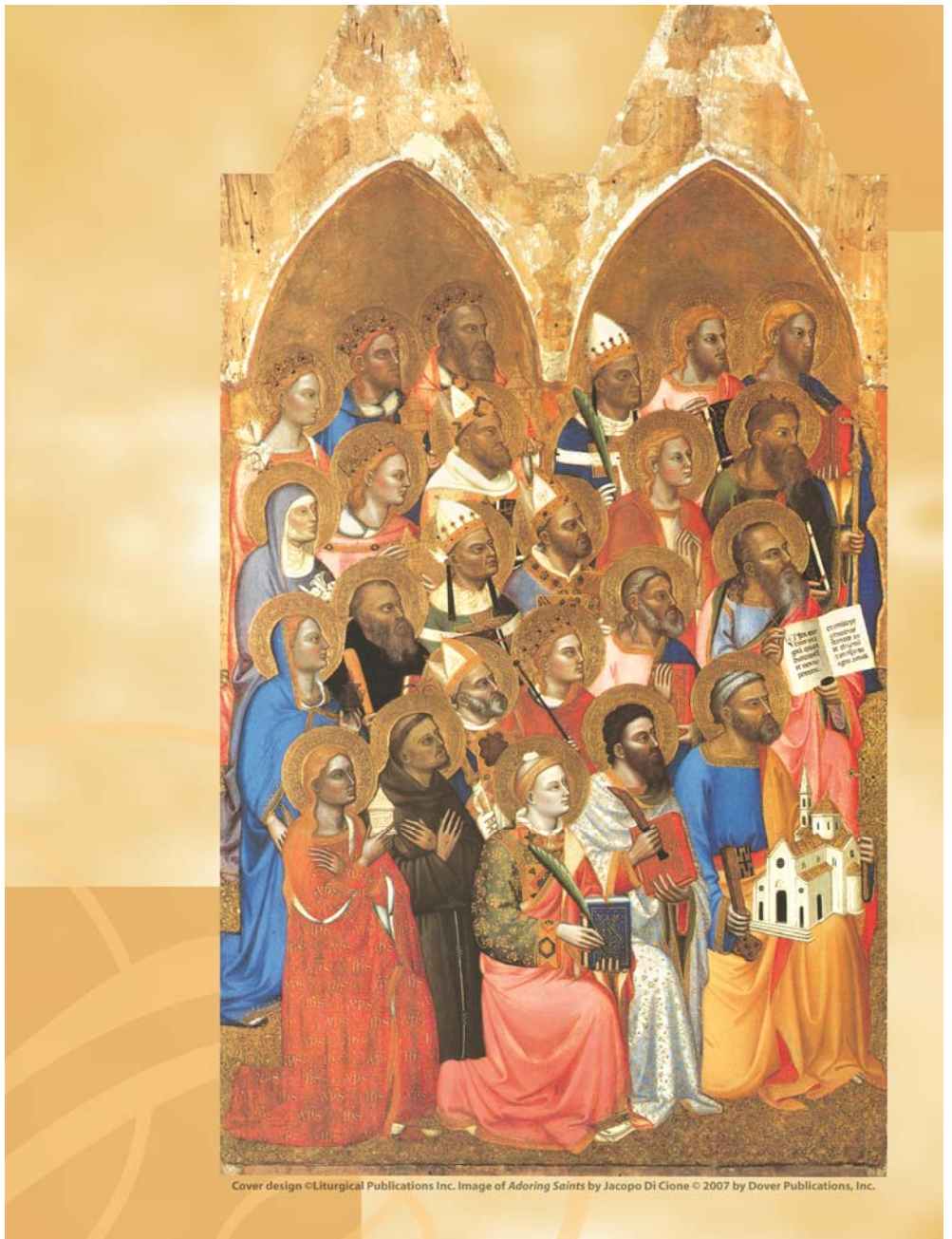

FROM THE DESK OF FR. PAUL

THIRTY SECOND SUNDAY - November 6, 2016

2 Maccabees 7: 1-2, 9-14; 2 Thessalonians 2: 16- 3:5; Luke 20: 27-38

WHEN HIS GLORY APPEARS OUR JOY WILL BE FULL

This week is a very significant week for our All Saints Community. Today we begin our 100 years. I am sure that we can be proud of lot of things, not just of the things that we have achieved in our 100 years, but the impression and impact we as a community have made. Throughout the good and bad times we have remained faithful and committed to our witnessing life. Enlightened by the Word of God, nurtured by the Eucharist, and made one by the mission, we have affirmed and strengthened our identity as the faithful disciples of our Master and Lord. This centennial year is truly a moment of thanksgiving for the gifts of faith, fellowship (communion) and mission. We not only bring our successes, victories and achievements to God today, but also our weaknesses, failures and losses in view of strengthening and deepening our love for God and one another. "Treasuring Our Past and Embracing Our Future" is the motto of our centennial celebration. How can we be a joyous community as we step into the next decade?

I just want to take the responsorial Psalm of this Sunday which affirms that our joy will be full when his glory appears. It is Irenaeus, one of the early Fathers of the Church, who said that the glory of God is man fully alive. When we as a community of All Saints are fully alive, vibrant and life-giving then God is glorified and when his glory appears our joy will truly be full. The first scripture for this Sunday, taken from the Second Book of Maccabees, can teach us an important lesson as to how we are to remain joyful despite the challenges and struggles. The arrest, torture, persecution and killings could not deter the mother and seven sons from their faithfulness to the law of God. Their commitment to the law of God (one of the brothers says, "we are ready to die rather than transgress the laws of our ancestors") was their strength and power. What is our commitment and source of our strength?

As we move to the gospel, we see Jesus being tested by the attempted trickery of the Sadducees posing a hypothetical question based on the Mosaic practice of levirate marriage. Jesus' response first begins with the rules of heaven. Jesus points out the truth that "marrying and giving in marriage" is a characteristic of this life and not of the next. Then he goes on to argue from the book of Exodus that God is the God of the living and not of the dead. By making a specific reference to Moses' experience of the 'burning bush' from the Book of Exodus, where God is revealed as "I am who am" (Exodus 3:14) Jesus reminds us that God is the living one, the existing one, and he is the God of life. It is by being and becoming witnesses of the God of life and modeling our life on the lives of the Saints who are our patrons and who gave their life in fidelity to the God of life, we become alive. We reveal God's glory when we are fully alive and when his glory is revealed our joy will be full and complete!

Summary of Comments re: Music:

There is a strong need for uplifting, inspirational, contemporary (post Vatican II), modern music.

Music Liturgy is essential to a thriving parish; All Saints needs to take a serious look at what music liturgy has to offer; maybe different styles to accommodate different tastes, e.g., chamber music may not resonate with families.

More resources need to be committed to music.

Need more music that is current and “singable” like that at the school masses; a strong music liturgy that appeals to families.

Music should encourage participation, songs should be familiar, sung often enough to be learned.

More connection to school band; Consider creation of a school choir.

During one visit to Cleveland for a catechetical conference, I visited the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame three times. I love learning the stories of bands and how they rose to fame. I love to see artifacts of days gone by, sharing with me a time I have only heard stories about and some even reminding me of the days of my youth. But it is the music that makes it all worthy of my attention. Without the music, the stories and memories have no appeal to me or anyone else.

People who come together with a singular purpose create good music, the kind that people continue to listen to for generations. When you belong in a really good band, it is more than a job. You are a part of something larger than yourself and when working collectively with the other members of the band, you can become creators of something magical.

But when a good band breaks up, the magic ends. Sometimes it is due to inflated egos, inequity in finances, or mistrust. A band member may think he or she can just start another band or join an existing one and the new chemistry will again lead to the creation of good music. But too often, the result is never as good as imagined.

The body of Christ is like a band that is always able to produce great music. The bandleader is always faithful and always has the best interest of the band in mind. If only his bandmates can steer clear of ego, jealousy, and mistrust of one another, the band will rejoice in a heavenly hall of fame.

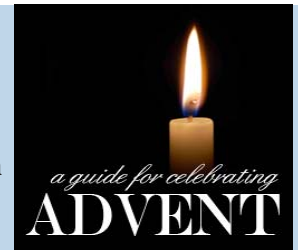

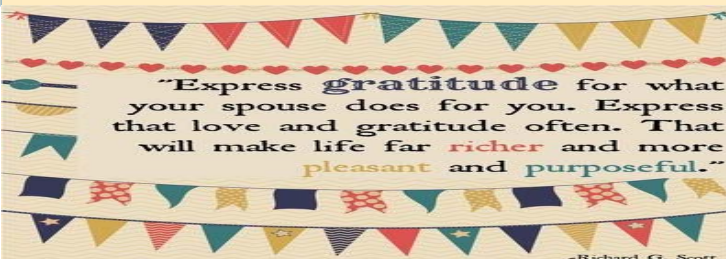
