FROM THE DESK OF FR. PAUL

THIRTY FIRST SUNDAY - October 30, 2016

**Wisdom 11: 22-12:2; 2 Thessalonians 1: 11-22; Luke 19: 1-10
DESIRE TO SEE JESUS AND YOU WILL BE SEEN BY HIM**

The liturgy for this Sunday invites us to come to God, who is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and of great kindness, to be saved. The Psalm we sing as our response to the scriptures we hear today, declares that our God is good to all and compassionate toward all his works. How are we to come to this God? How are we to have an experience of this God? How can we come to encounter such a loving and gracious God? Let us look deep into the three readings for an answer.

The way proposed by the Book of Wisdom, our first scripture for the day, is to believe in God's love and mercy. We hear a convincing argument from the Book of Wisdom to believe in God's love and mercy. It says that God "overlooks people's sins". It further says that he loathes nothing that he has made and spares all things that he has made. The imperishable spirit of God, "Lord and lover of souls," is in all things. This unquestionably is the reason for us not to lose hope in God's mercy and love.

St. Paul's prayer for the Thessalonians, the second scripture for this Sunday, shows us another way to encounter the merciful and loving God. Striving to live a life worthy of our call in a way that would complete and fulfill "every good purpose and every effort of faith." This sincere effort and attempt will eventually result in the glorification of the name of the Lord. The simple way to encounter the Lord of great kindness and compassion is to live a life or make a sincere attempt toward a life that will give glory to him.

The Gospel story this Sunday illustrates another smart way in reaching this goal in its description of the encounter between Zacchaeus and Jesus. This story can be seen as a powerful reminder to us of the truth that no human condition is incompatible with God's salvific and redemptive mercy. Zacchaeus, the chief tax collector, had too many odds to believe in the possibility of God's mercy and love. Non-acceptance, hatred and the sense of shame - all that was left in his life could be explained by these experiences. He had much of wealth but few friends! Still, there was a desire to see Jesus. Even this had its own challenge. To have a glimpse he had to shame himself by climbing a tree as a result of his physical stature. Salvation came to his house not because of what he did or was willing to do. All that Zacchaeus did was just a response to what Jesus did - for coming to his house and proclaiming salvation to his whole house. The only thing that Zacchaeus had was the true desire to see Jesus. Our desire to see Jesus will help us to be seen by him. To be seen by him is salvation and redemption!

Summary of Comments re: Music:

There is a strong need for uplifting, inspirational, contemporary (post Vatican II), modern music.

Music Liturgy is essential to a thriving parish; All Saints needs to take a serious look at what music liturgy has to offer; maybe different styles to accommodate different tastes, e.g., chamber music may not resonate with families.

More resources need to be committed to music.

Need more music that is current and “singable” like that at the school masses; a strong music liturgy that appeals to families.

Music should encourage participation, songs should be familiar, sung often enough to be learned.

More connection to school band; Consider creation of a school choir.

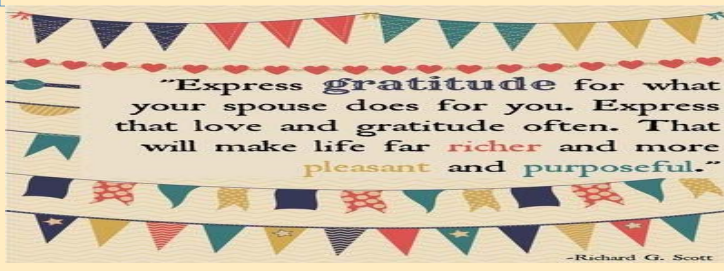
