Malachi 3: 19-20; 2 Thessalonians 3: 7-12; Luke 21: 5-19

BY PERSEVERANCE WE CAN SECURE OUR LIFE

As we approach the end of the liturgical year, we see a shift from the end of life to the end of the world. In the last week the liturgy posed focus on the resurrection at the end of life. This week we hear about the “Day of the Lord” (in the first reading from the book of the prophet Malachi), the Parousia or the Lord’s coming (the second reading from St. Paul), and the signs and occurrences preceding the end of the world (in the gospel). How are we to understand the theme of the end of times and how are we to prepare ourselves for the end of the world? These two questions will be the focus of our reflection for this Sunday.

It is important to bear in mind that the solemn announcement in the first reading (“lo, the day is coming”) is part of the long prophetic tradition of Israel where we hear the prophets teaching Israel to hope for the Day of the Lord. The first characteristic of this day is that the Lord gathers all the nations for judgment (refer Zephaniah 3:8; Isaiah 3:7-12). This promise of judgment need not be understood negatively as the day of punishment only. From the perspective of the God-fearing, it is a day of fulfillment. Against the background of exile and the consequent experiences of pain and suffering, it meant God rescuing them with his power and might from their persecutors. For those people, whose life is threatened by the overwhelming and the apparent all pervasive darkness, the Day of the Lord is like the light erupting into the darkness dispelling the fear and hopelessness associated with it. See how the prophecy of Malachi ends in the first reading. “But for you who fear my name, there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays”.

In the gospel we hear Jesus announcing the signs and occurrences that will precede the Day of the Lord. These signs and occurrences are not to be taken literally. The language, which is referred to as apocalyptic language, is symbolic in nature and it is primarily intended to interpret the future events and not to predict the future events. What then is the meaning of these unusual and terrifying events? The first meaning is to be watchful. It invites us to let the thought of what is to come guide our present life. We are not to be alarmed by the imagery of wars, earthquakes, famines, stars falling from the heavens. These are Jewish apocalyptic terms employed by the early Church to denote their hope for some radical changes at the second coming of Christ.

The second coming of the Lord, the Parousia, is intended to increase hope, encouragement and to ensure a future with God. The language in the gospel is not meant to frighten us. Neither is it intended to discourage or dispirit us. Rather, it is just the opposite that is the purpose of this talk. It is encouraging the dispirited and uplifting the drooping spirits of those in pain, suffering and hopelessness. Such people are reminded that God is in control of everything that happens in the world. Therefore it is not surprising that the gospel ends with this affirmation: “not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives.”

Summary of Comments re: Music:

There is a strong need for uplifting, inspirational, contemporary (post Vatican II), modern music.

Music Liturgy is essential to a thriving parish; All Saints needs to take a serious look at what music liturgy has to offer; maybe different styles to accommodate different tastes, e.g., chamber music may not resonate with families.

More resources need to be committed to music.

Need more music that is current and “singable” like that at the school masses; a strong music liturgy that appeals to families.

Music should encourage participation, songs should be familiar, sung often enough to be learned.

More connection to school band; Consider creation of a school choir.

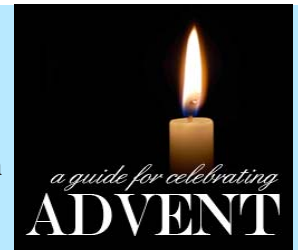

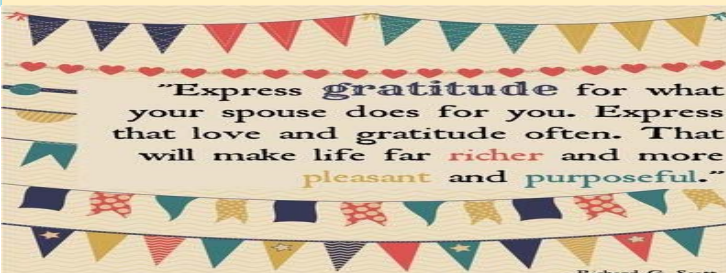
