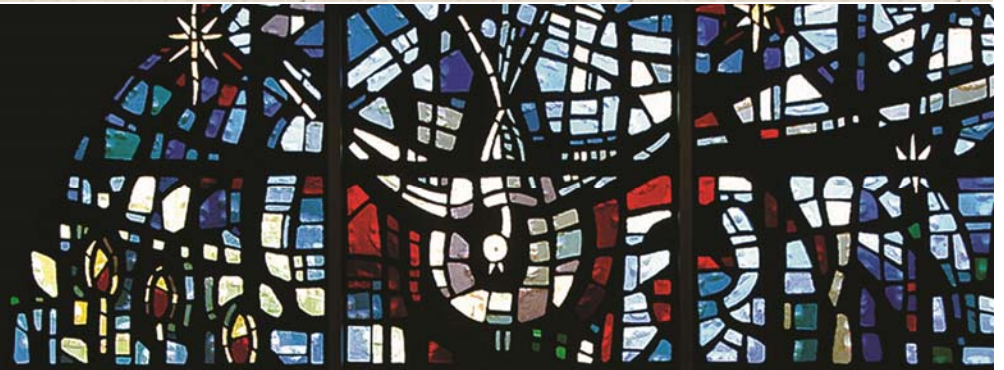
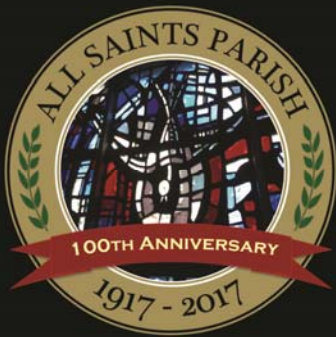

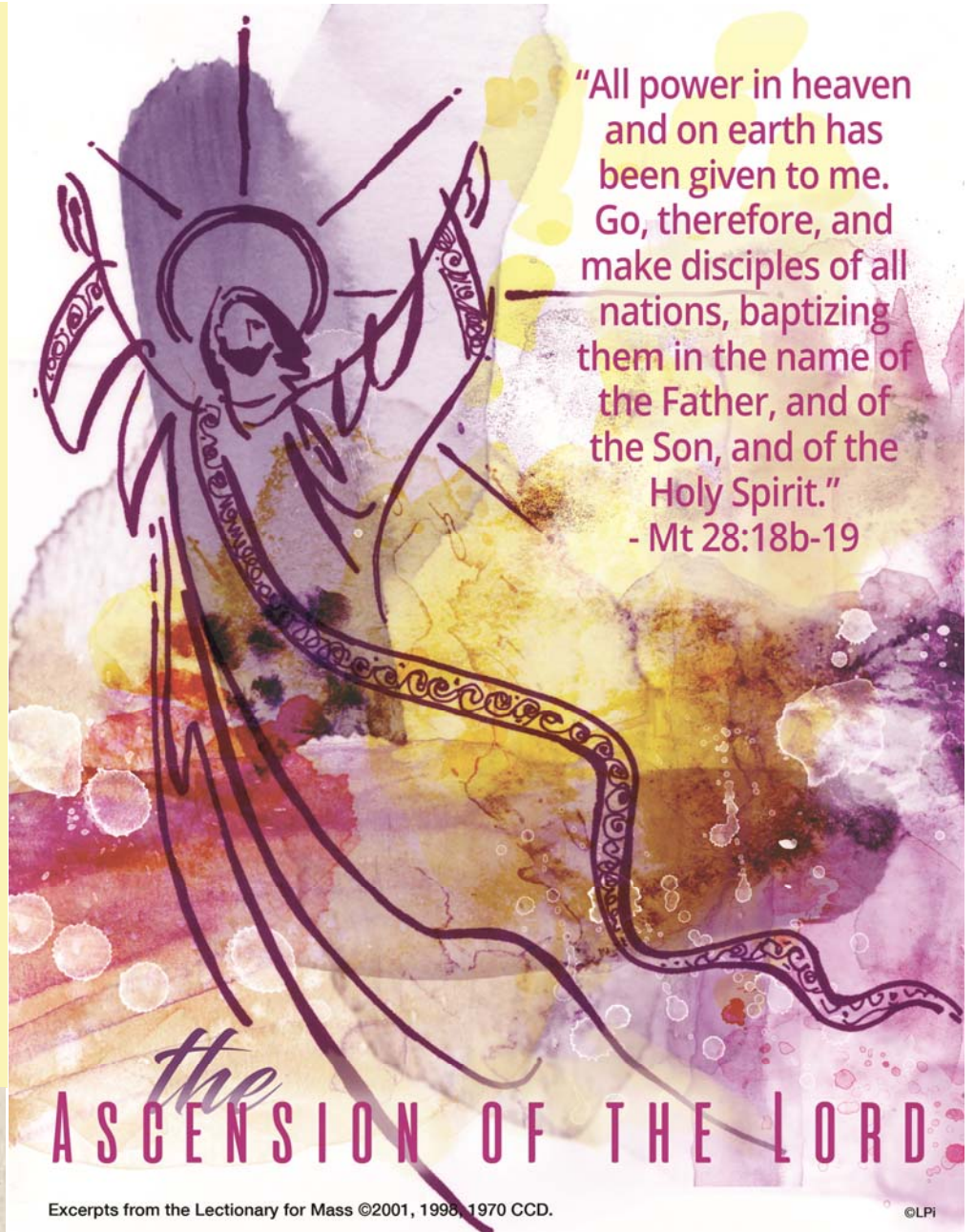

FROM THE DESK OF FR. PAUL

THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD - MAY 28, 2017 Acts 1: 1-11; Ephesians 1: 17-23; Matthew 28: 16-20 FIND THE NEW WAY OF BEING WITH JESUS THROUGH FAITH AND DISCIPLESHIP

We are in the last Sunday of Easter, a season that culminates in the celebration of the Ascension of the Lord. As we hear in the scriptures, especially the first reading from the Acts, Jesus is lifted up and disappears into the cloud. Does it mean that we are celebrating the absence of the Lord from us? What really is the meaning of the Ascension of our Lord? What is the message of this feast for us today?

Departures or leaving can significantly affect people in different ways, some for worse and some for good. When it impacts someone for good, it can gradually bring him/her to find new ways of being with the one who has left or departed. It is true of Ascension too. Jesus' departure or leaving impacted the disciples and apostles for good and that they were able to find gradually new ways of being with him. This new way of being with Jesus is rooted in and founded on the promise of Jesus we find in the first reading and the gospel. The same Jesus who is taken away from the apostles/disciples will return (the first reading) and the same Jesus will be with us always until the end of the age (the gospel) are the promises that lie at the new way of being with Jesus.

Can we explore more deeply into this new way of being with Jesus? The scriptures for this Sunday remind us that the physical absence of the Lord places a specific task and responsibility on the disciples. While the risen Lord is being lifted up, and was taken by a cloud from the sight of the disciples, they were standing there and were looking up to the sky. It was at this time a rebuke comes from the angels: "Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky"? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven". This is not just a rebuke to the disciples staring at the sky, but also a command to get to work. What is the work that they are asked to do?

The gospel for today very vividly and unambiguously talks about the task and the responsibility of the disciples stating, "Go and make disciples of all nations," and "teach them to observe all that I have commanded you". Making disciples and teaching all that Jesus has taught are not two different tasks, but are one and the same. We make disciples for Jesus by teaching all that Jesus commanded. This is precisely the task and the responsibility given to the disciples on the day of Ascension. The command to make disciples by teaching what Jesus taught us takes our mission to a new level. We are certainly not talking about an aggressive evangelization that aims at baptizing people in great numbers. Instead, we are talking about inviting people to a life of discipleship by way of accepting the gospel (Good News), entering into a personal relationship with Jesus and walking in the footsteps of Jesus who himself was the Good News. Our fidelity to the mission of Jesus will make Jesus alive and active today. In other words, the promise of Jesus in today's gospel (I am with you always until the end of the age) will become real and Jesus indeed will become present today by our truthfulness to the mission of making disciples to Jesus. Through our faith and discipleship we will be able to find Jesus' continuous and permanent presence with us!

The keys of St. Peter, the cross of St. Andrew, the shells of St. James the Lesser, the chalice and serpent of St. John, the triumphal cross of St. Philip, the knife of St. Bartholomew, the T-square of St. Thomas, the book and pilgrim staff of St. James the greater, the fish of St. Simon, the boat of St. Jude, the money-purse of St. Matthew, and the axe of St. Matthias.
